POSITION DESCRIPTION

ICP is seeking graduate and undergraduate students interested in community and national service, public policy, communications, non-profit management, and/or international affairs for a Spring 2009 Research and Communications internship.

The intern's primary responsibility will be to work with the ICP team on a number of research projects and communications activities. Each intern is assigned specific projects based on interest and skills. Possible tasks include:

1. Researching youth service programs and policies around the world;
2. Conducting research and interviews for youth service country and program profiles;
3. Maintaining ICP's global database on youth service policies and programs;
4. Contributing to the content and production of the monthly e-newsletter *Service News Worldwide* and to ICP's Blog
5. Managing ICP's library of materials related to youth civic engagement

An ideal candidate will:

- have excellent analytical and writing skills
- have previous research experience, preferably in the social sciences field
- be creative, organized and responsible
- be flexible and comfortable multi-tasking as well as working independently and as part of a team
- be willing to commit minimum 20 hours a week (days and times are flexible); preference given to applicants available full-time.
- knowledge of foreign languages preferred
- knowledge of national and community service projects in the United States and/or abroad preferred
- experience in journalism, web-publishing, and/or desktop publishing preferred
